“What Should Our Elected Officials Be Doing?”



The economy of the United States is in recession. People are being laid off, families are losing their homes, retirement funds have lost huge percentages of their value, corporations are declaring bankruptcy, and many are without health insurance while medical costs continue to rise. What are the responsibilities of our elected officials during this crisis?

Israel and Judah were independent nations for about 400 years. During those years, God spoke to the leaders of those governments through the prophets. The prophets clearly and forcefully articulated God’s expectations. God then judged the two nations on the basis of whether or not they fulfilled those expectations.

The books of the prophets are a record of God’s word to the officials of Israel and Judah during the four hundred years of their independence. The verses quoted below contain a few of the responsibilities given to them and also contain God’s evaluation of them based on how well they are meeting those responsibilities.

Isaiah 1:23

“Everyone loves a bribe and runs after gifts. They do not defend the orphan and the widow’s cause does not come before them.”

God is condemning the government for two reasons. First, the rulers are using their positions of responsibility to gain wealth and luxury. They accept gifts from special interest groups and they accept bribes. Those gifts and bribes are given to insure that those receiving them will make decisions favorable to those offering them.

God is disgusted because the responsibility of government officials is not to pursue their own well being but to provide for the well being of those who cannot provide for themselves.

Isaiah 10:1- 2

“Ah, you who...write oppressive statutes, to...rob the poor of my people of their right, that widows may be your spoil, and that you may make orphans your prey!”

God is disgusted with the king and leaders for enacting laws that take advantage of, and even exploit, the very people that the laws of the land should protect and help. God is saying that those who are vulnerable are the responsibility of the government.

Jeremiah 22:15

“Are you a king because you compete in cedar?”

Cedar trees grew tall and straight. Their red wood was resistant to decay and insects. Because of these qualities, cedar was much sought after for fine and important buildings. Thus, for a king or other government official, if your palace was larger than and included more cedar than someone else’s, you had more prestige and status than they. This is what Jeremiah meant by **“you compete in cedar”**.

God is angered by such competition. God demands that the kings and government officials give up this competition and instead attend to **“the cause of the poor and the needy”** (Jeremiah 22:16).

Jeremiah reminds the kings and leaders in 22:1- 4 that God judges them according to how well they obey this command and reminds them that God blesses those nations and governments who fulfill this responsibility.

One of the standards to which God consistently held the kings and governments of Israel and Judah accountable was the care and support of those who could not adequately provide for themselves.

As God did in the past, I believe God does today. It is the responsibility of governments to help those who cannot help themselves. During this economic recession hardships have come to many. So, let us remember the national responsibility given to us by God.

“God has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?” (Micah 6:8)

Elder of the Month



Bea Ritschard is our May Elder of the Month. Bea joined the church in 1942. She remembers that she didn't have to take a membership class or take part in a worship service as we do now. Instead

she simply received a card in the mail telling her she was in! Over the years Bea has served on the Church Council, on Property Committee, as President of the Woman's Guild, as President and Secretary of the Naomi Circle, on the 125th Anniversary Planning Committee, on several Search Committees, and for 26 years on the Counting Committee.

According to Bea, the church has changed a lot over the years. Bea remembers that when she was asked to be part of the Church Council in 1960's, she was only the third woman to ever serve on Council. Bea also has many fond memories of the good work done by the St. John's Woman's Guild. In 1980's, when Bea was President of the Guild, they raised \$6,050 at the Fall Bazaar, a record that has never been broken. In more recent years, Bea has been a mainstay of the Parish Visitors. Not only does Bea have a special talent for knowing the names and family connections of almost everyone in our church, she also is the group's designated greeting card maker. Each month, Bea still makes every single one of the cards that our church sends to our homebound, hospitalized and over 90 year old members.
