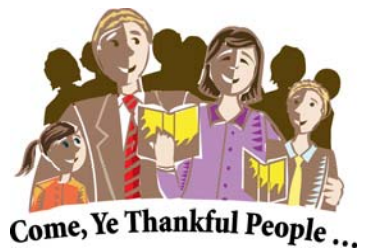

At The End of the Rope and Beyond

There has been no let up. Even though life has been difficult for many for many months, the trouble keeps coming.

Individuals who have been struggling to survive suddenly find themselves facing additional troubles. Nations that are struggling to endure one crisis find themselves beset by another. There is no let up in the arrival of trouble.

When a person, who is already struggling, then has to attempt to cope with much more and even worse, where does one find the resources? Where does one find the spiritual reserves and material resources to help your family and yourself let alone people in other lands who are suffering from tsunamis, floods, earthquakes, corrupt governments, drought, fires, or terrorism?

Sometimes it feels like the words of **Psalm 22** are our words:

“My God, My God, why have you forsaken me?
Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning?
O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer; and by night, but find no rest.
Do not be far from me, for trouble is near and there is no one to help.”

In times such as these, where do we find hope? **Psalm 77** suggests that we turn to our memory, specifically our memory of the stories of our faith, the stories of God’s actions in the past:

“I will remember your wonders of old. I will meditate on all your work, and muse on your mighty deeds.
You are God who works wonders; With your strong arm you redeemed your people...”
When we feel like God is not responding to our prayers and when we are tempted to lose hope, remember the stories of God helping people in the past. These stories remind us that, because God could and did help people in the past, God can help us now.

These stories proclaim that there is good reason and a solid foundation, for hope. They encourage us and urge us to have hope, and to find the source of that hope in God. According to **Psalm 130**:

“Out of the depths, I cry to you, O Lord.
Lord, hear my voice! Let your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!
I wait for the Lord, my soul waits, and in God’s word I hope...
Hope in the Lord! For with God there is steadfast love,
And with God there is great power to redeem.

When things won’t let up, do the best you can to take care of yourself and your family, and do your best to help others. Beyond that, in the spirit of **Psalm 22**, pray and cry out to God; reading **Psalm 77**, remember how God helped in the past; and trusting in **Psalm 130**, put your hope in God.

Children’s and Junior Choirs have Moved!

The Children’s and Junior Choirs now have a new rehearsal time: Wednesdays, right after school. The Junior Choir, for grades 4-8, meets from 3:30-4:00pm in the choir room, followed by Kids Club for 4:00-4:30pm. Young singers in grades 1-3 meet for Children’s Choir rehearsal from 4:00-4:30pm following Kids Club from 3:30-4:00. If more information is needed on either activity, please contact Yvonne in the office and she will get you steered in the right direction.

The Junior Choir particularly has a real need for more voices. While we realize there are so many (perhaps too many)

offerings and activities for kids these days, the future existence of our choir programs, particularly for children, is dependent on having enough participants to make them worthwhile to continue. St. John’s has had a long history of choir programs for young singers, and it would be unfortunate if some day those choirs would no longer be offered as part of our music ministry.

The Youth Ensemble, for grades 7-12, has been discontinued for this year due to every low number of interested participants. Singers in grades 7 or 8 are being redirected to the Junior Choir, while high

schoolers are invited to sing with the Sanctuary Choir on Wednesday evenings at 7:00pm.

Deborah Krauss Smith, St. John’s director of music/organist, is currently directing the Children’s and Junior Choirs following the recent resignation of Jill Leuzinger. Deb directed both choirs before, from 1986-1996, and has nearly 20 years of experience directing children’s choirs and working with young voices. We hope parents will help secure the future of St. John’s graded choir program and encourage their children to participate in a choir.

Deadline for 2009 Contributions

IRS regulations state that donors must deliver or mail (and postmark) contributions by December 31st in order to claim a charitable contribution deduction for 2009. Checks that are placed in the church offering on Sunday, January 3, 2010 or are mailed after December 31,

2009 will not qualify for a charitable contribution deduction in 2009 even if the check is post-dated to 2009. It is also important for you to know that the church office will not be open after noon on December

31st so any contributions must be brought in no later than NOON on December 31, 2009 to qualify for the 2009 deduction. We must follow these regulations and will not be able to make any exceptions.

Receive, at a minimum, one visit per month with the child's case worker and ongoing support through phone and email with the worker and foster care coordinator.

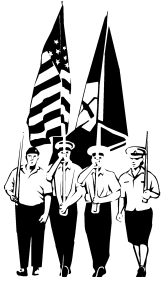
