“For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven”

~Ecclesiastes 3:1



We are deep into the dog days of summer. Few things are as pleasant as the long, warm days of summer in Southern Wisconsin. The sun is shining, flowers are blooming, and softball games are in full swing. The cold days of winter seem a lifetime away. There are so many places and events to get out to and enjoy. The challenge of summer becomes how we squeeze everything we want to do into such a tight time frame. Summer is so short – and there is so much we want to do in it!

In these busy summer months, it is good to be reminded by the book of Ecclesiastes that although life is short, there is a time for everything. A good life, says Ecclesiastes, is filled with both mourning, and dancing; weeping and laughing; breaking down and building up. We shouldn't waste too much time worrying, says Ecclesiastes, because many of the things that we strive after and agonize about are little more than vanities. The Hebrew word translated as vanities, could also be translated as “absurd”; “empty” or “futile”. The key word is Hebrew *Heve*, meaning something like chasing after the breeze. Your striving, your worrying, says Ecclesiastes is empty, futile, absurd and like chasing after wind.

There is much that we can't control, says Ecclesiastes, and all of the success, power and wealth we accumulate can't protect us. Yet Ecclesiastes remains hopeful. In response to the “vanity” of life, Ecclesiastes makes two points. The first is to, “Fear God, and keep God's commandments; for that is the whole duty of everyone.” Secondly, says Ecclesiastes, enjoy life and all that is good in it: food, drink, love, work, and play! If he lived in Southern Wisconsin, I'm sure Ecclesiastes would also have mentioned horse-shoes, euchre, days at the pool with children and grandchildren, picnics and cook-outs. These pleasures, says Ecclesiastes are gifts from God.

I wonder if perhaps part of the invitation of this familiar text is to remember that there is enough time for all that is the most important. One of the great joys of summer is to simply and wonderfully BE in it. To soak up this time because we know it won't come again. To walk slowly in the warm breeze; to pause and sit on the porch for a moment when you get home; to put off fixing dinner for an hour or two and simply sit, to take deep breaths as you walk around your yard, breathing in the wealth of this season.

A final bit of wisdom from Ecclesiastes for the summer months, “Enjoy life with those you love... for this is your portion in life.”

You will be asked to supply some basic information, then taken to a page to help you "Get Started". You can generally ignore all of those steps, and news from the pages you "Like" (see the directions in the paragraph above.) Also in a link to "Privacy Settings", allowing you to make your personal page as visible to others (or invisible) as you'd like. Admittedly, getting to know your way around Facebook can be frustrating until you get the hang of it. If you're new to Facebook and need some help or have questions, please email debstjohns@tds.net and we'll try to find an answer for you.

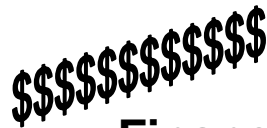
Green County Food Pantry

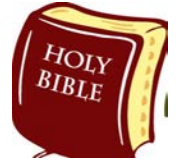
Registration For Faith Zone

This year St. John's church raised over \$400 for Habitat and welcomed 6 new riders. Thank you to all who donated to Habitat for Humanity in Green County.

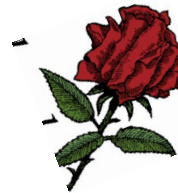
Thank You, Evelyn
